





Threshold Defense and Secured Interior Space Zones

We understand that there is more than one type of protective enhancement that may be necessary and we can adapt our patented modular components to ensure that right solution for any entrance or interior space. Our three zone systems will work for most schools.

Zone 1

Primary Threshold Vestibule

The primary entrance of a school building typically employs a dual entry through multiple doors. Both sets of doors can be glass or wood and can be secured during the school day. Often the first set of doors will lead to the entrance to the school office or a security desk. Our modular system is constructed with bullet resistant materials to provide the essentials of protection and can include doors with locking systems to impede an attacker.

Zone 2 Secondary Threshold Defense

Should there be a breach and an imminent threat is realized within the building, a secondary line of protection can offer an increased number of safe spaces to provide enhanced security until authorities arrive. A key offering in our bullet resistant solutions includes a single door that can be used in classrooms, auditoriums or other spaces. This door can include a glass light which allows for upgraded safety without sacrificing normalcy.

Zone 3 Secured Interior Space

Creating additional Secured Zones within common areas such as a media center or auditorium foyer can provide additional protective spaces for multiple people. These secured interior spaces can be constructed using our modular components and will increase the chance for members of the school community to evade an imminent threat situation until they can evacuate.





Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

Will my school look like a prison? No! Our system will match the current décor and style of your school.

What kinds of guns will the system stop? Our Level 5 protection, which is standard in our products, will stop all handguns and many Assault Rifles such as the AK-47 and AR-15.

Can I use my current security lockdown system and hardware? Yes, if you are happy with your current lockdown hardware it can be reused in our systems.

Will this look like other doors in my school? Yes. Our doors are slightly thicker to accommodate the ballistic features, but they will look and feel like other doors in your school.

What if I can't afford to protect my whole school? We can tailor the levels of safety and security to your schools needs budget, additionally we have a financing option to help manage payments.

What schools currently have them?

Very few schools have this type of protection because it simply hasn't been available to schools until recently. Our system is bringing affordable and discreet protection to the schools.

How long does installation take? This of course depends on the amount of work to be completed, but many larger installations, like a vestibule system, can be completed over a long weekend.

What is your current lead time per school? Current manufacturing times are changing by the day as more schools move toward this type of a solution, but typical lead times are 8-10 weeks.

Can our desks and furniture be retrofitted to make it safer? Yes, we can replace or retrofit existing built-in and freestanding furniture to provide more safety and security to those that use it.

What else can be made safer and more secure? We can use our modular components to protect classroom doors, hallway doors, critical spaces and areas, and walls.
